

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE ASSOCIATION OF STUDENT CHAPTERS OF  
THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS, INC.

TO: The Recorder of Deeds, D.C.  
Washington, D.C.

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporators of a corporation, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation pursuant to the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Act:

FIRST: The name of the corporation is The Association of Student Chapters of The American Institute of Architects, Inc.

SECOND: The period of duration is perpetual.

THIRD: This corporation is organized for charitable, scientific, and educational purposes as may qualify it as exempt from federal tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law. More specifically, such purposes include, but are not limited to: organizing architectural students and combining their efforts to advance the science and art of planning and building for the benefit of the public interest by advancing the standards of architectural education, training, scientific research, and

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practice; uniting the building industry and the profession of architecture in education and scientific research directed to insure the advancement of living standards of the general public through their improved environment; and participating in any and all other activities related thereto permitted for a charitable, scientific, and educational organization which qualifies as exempt from federal tax under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law.

FOURTH: The corporation is to have members as provided in the Bylaws.

FIFTH: The Board of Directors shall be selected as provided for in the Bylaws.

SIXTH: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or to otherwise attempt to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in

(including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law.

SEVENTH: The assets of the corporation, in the event of dissolution or final liquidation, shall be applied and distributed as follows: All liabilities and obligations of the corporation shall be paid, satisfied, and discharged, or provision shall be made therefor; any assets held on the condition they be returned, transferred or conveyed upon dissolution shall be disposed of in accordance with such requirements; all remaining assets of every nature and description whatsoever, shall be distributed to one or more corporation, funds, or foundations, qualified for exemption from tax as an exclusively charitable or educational corporation fund or foundation under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or its successor provisions.

EIGHTH: The address, including street and number, of its initial registered office is 1735 New York Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20006, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is The AIA Corporation.




