NOMINATIONS FOR THE AIAS STUDENT RESEARCH HONOR AWARD ARE JUDGED ON THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA WITH AWARDS GIVEN TO INDIVIDUALS WHOSE SUBMISSION MATERIALS EXEMPLIFY OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS IN AREAS SUCH AS (BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO):

- Design research
- Written dissertation
- Applied research or initiative

- Letters of Support, describing unique and special accomplishments of the nominee as they pertain to the evaluation criteria, from:
 - 1. The AIAS or faculty member initiating nomination
 - 2. The AIAS Chapter Faculty Advisor or thesis advisor / mentor
 - 3. Additional letters of support (limit two)
- Supporting Materials
 - 1. Main Requirement Project brief / abstract describing intent and origin of research.
 - 2. Any support materials or information needed for the nominee to cohesively convey the products or outcomes of research or applied research.
 - 3. Headshot or Team Photo
- Submission may not exceed 10MB
