SUBMISSIONS FOR THE AIAS OUTSTANDING LEARNING AND TEACHING CULTURE HONOR AWARD ARE JUDGED ON EXEMPLIFICATION OF OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE IN AREAS SUCH AS (BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO):

- Unwavering commitment to student, professor, and faculty health and wellbeing, mental health, time management & school-life-work balance, professional conduct, diversity & solidarity, constructive evaluations & instruction, collaborative community, respectful stewardship & space management
- Creation and effective implementation of a Learning and Teaching Culture Policy by both student and faculty stakeholders that results in measurable culture shifts
- Outstanding collaboration and cooperation between students and faculty, including but not limited to: willingness to accept feedback, dedication to larger conversations about society, architectural education, issues facing students, or other topics
- All supporting documents (letters of support exempted) have high graphic quality

NOTE: This award should be filled out by a nominating student and a representative of the administration or faculty

 - 2. Description of advocacy efforts and impact on the school culture in addition to the creation of the policy
 - 3. Any support materials that help exemplify the advocacy of the individual, team, chapter, program, or event, i.e. photographic evidence or videography
