Charlie brings a broad set of experiences to the support of the design community and associated professional and advocacy organizations, currently serving as Interim Executive Director of the American Institute of Architecture Students (AIAS). He also, along with his wife, Dr. Julie Lesnik, recently launched a new nonprofit called "Octopus & Ape"---an educational digital media channel aimed at making scientific topics accessible and engaging for a broad public audience---and brings his association management and event production expertise to the support of other nonprofit organizations on a contract basis.

Charlie received his Bachelor's degree from the School of Music, Theatre, and Dance at the University of Michigan in Production Management and Lighting Design, and a Masters degree in Architecture from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.
