The newly elected board officially begins their duties on the 1st of July, and will be sworn in during Grassroots 2016. In the six-month lead up to commencing their terms, the board-elect will work closely with their predecessors to become familiar with their role on the board, including a three-day orientation concurrent with the Spring Board of Directors Meeting.
